Ahmedabad, The term "Social distancing" might sound like an emotional phase in early but in reality, it is a public health term describing our best defense against the coronavirus. Social distancing practices are the changes in behaviour that can help stop the spread of Coronavirus infections.

Social distancing is not the same as self-quarantine or isolation, though other practices being utilized to minimize the coronavirus spread. The key difference is that a quarantine or isolation restricts the movement of people within a certain area or zone to limit transferring and spreading an infection. Measures like social distancing can help communities achieve that second line - a slower growth in the number of cases - so that they have more time and resources to care for all the sick patients. While social distancing may seem like a drastic step to take, it's just a precautionary measure. The most obvious way to practice social distancing is to avoid crowded public places where close contact with others may occur. These might include movie theaters, religious gatherings, birthday and wedding ceremonies and crowded restaurants.

Three arrested for opening fire after dispute over construction of boundary wall

Gururam, Three suspects were arrested by the police on Friday for allegedly firing at and injuring three people following a dispute over construction of a wall in Behrampur village on Thursday evening. The suspects had allegedly fired at the victims when they were constructing a wall of a farmhouse. The police said the victims - Ravi Bhat, Mohit Shukla and Himanshu Mishra - were undergoing treatment at a private hospital.

Preet Pal Sangwan, ACP, Gururam police, said that the victims had taken a contract to construct a boundary, which was opposed by the Mahesh, Rishi and Karamvir. "There was a conflict between the two groups and on Thursday one group opened fire with an intention to kill the other three men. They were arrested within 24 hours of the incident," he said.

Punjab Police gets booster shot to tackle new-age crimes

Chandigarh, Chief minister Captain Amarinder Singh on Saturday announced that all districts in Punjab will have dedicated technical, narcotics, social media, forensic and anti-sabotage checking units to strengthen law enforcement. Apart from 3,100 domain experts to combat specialised crimes such as cyber crime, 10,000 police officials will be recruited, of which 33% will be women, at the level of sub inspector and constables, to expand the ground force and ensure more effective policing, the chief minister said.

"The domain experts will be in the fields of law, forensics, digital forensics, information technology, data mining, cyber security, intelligence analysis, human resource management and development and road safety planning and engineering," said Captain Amarinder, who also holds the home portfolio.

Social distancing can reduce virus transmission from infected persons to susceptible individuals by increasing physical distance between people or reducing frequency of congregation in socially dense community settings, such as schools or workplaces. The best way to prevent "community spread" is to spread out the community.



It is widely viewed as an effective behavior and something that anyone and everyone should practice. Until a vaccine or even an effective treatment can be developed, the best hope for protecting ourselves is slowing the spread of the disease by practicing "social distancing". We must understand that the measures are aimed at trying to cut down the amount of virus spreading around, and ultimately protect those most vulnerable, including the elderly and people with weakened immune systems. It is also to be remembered that while social distancing may be an important factor in preventing the spread of coronavirus, practicing good hygiene and taking other safety precautions may also be important steps in

preventing the spread.

There is no doubt that the spread can be slowed down, if people practice social distancing by avoiding public spaces and generally limiting their movement. Let us remember that to stop the spread of the coronavirus, social distancing is becoming the new normal, at least for a few weeks. Let we, the individuals reduce our contact with one another as people will be less likely to pass the virus on. This can be the best way to prevent what we refer to as "community spread." State capital rolls out 'pink buses' for women

Ranchi, Buses meant exclusively for women, called "Pink Buses", were rolled out on the capital city's roads on Friday by Ranchi Municipal Corporation (RMC). The buses were flagged off by Ranchi mayor Anisha Lakra and RMC chief executive officer (CEO) Mukesh Kumar from city's Kutchery Chowk. The bus will run between Kutchery Chowk and Rajendra Chowk, around 7.5 km, at a nominal charge of ₹5. The service that takes its name from the colour of the bus was aimed at providing safe mode of transportation to women, who regularly face physical and mental harassment by miscreants on public transportation, officials said. Barring the driver, the buses have an all-female staff. However, the civic body was in search of a woman driver, officials said. It was to be noted that RMC was running two such buses earlier too. However, the service was suspended after a lockdown triggered by Covid-19 pandemic was implemented in March last year.

Besides, the old buses failed to get attention, as they were of the same colour as that of other city buses. Moreover, the old buses started to pick male

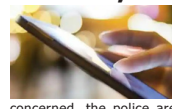
Illicit liquor making hooch busted in Punjab's Baba Bakala village

Chandigarh, An illicit liquor manufacturing unit in Punjab's Baba Bakala village was unearthed, and five people were arrested in Baba Bakala sub division of Amritsar district on Friday night in the fifth such racket to be busted this month. A team of the Amritsar rural police conducted a five-hour search at Jasso Nangal village of Baba Bakala and recovered 100 tonnes of lagan (raw material used for making illicit liquor), 370 litres of illicit liquor, 10 running stills, 16 tarpaulins, a water tank of 5,000-litre capacity, four drums (each of 200 litres capacity), 50 drums of 50 litres capacity each, eight LPG cylinders and two motorcycles. Those arrested were identified as Baljinder Singh, Gurmeet Singh, Komal Singh, Parmjit Singh and Gagandeep Singh, all residents of Jasso Nangal village. Police said the accused had been smuggling the illicit liquor into villages of Amritsar and Tarn Taran districts during early in the morning. Terming the racket as the main hub of illicit liquor manufacturing in Baba Bakala sub division, police said the involvement of

passengers due to low turnout of female passengers. However, RMC officials were hopeful that the new pink buses will turn out to be a success, as they were rolled out exclusively for women. "A lot of female passengers are provided in the bus in which passengers can lodge complaint in case male passengers were given entry into the bus or other issues," the Ranchi mayor said. RMC CEO Mukesh Kumar said, "The female passengers are being prepared. They will be rolled out between Dhurwa to Kishori Yadav Chowk via Kantolai next week." On the first day of being rolled out, the buses received positive response, officials said. RMC city manager Nandlal Barail, who was looking after the city bus operation in Ranchi, said, "The buses received a positive response on the very first day. College students and working women used the buses. After seeing this response, more buses will be pilled in the city." Sarita Devi, a passenger, said, "The most attractive part of the pink bus is its fare. It is providing a journey of 7km at just ₹5, while other modes of transport, whether an auto or e-rickshaw, take at least ₹20 for the same route."

Possible that children watch porn after online classes, says Rajasthan DGP

New Delhi, Speaking to reporters on the issue of women's safety in Rajasthan, DGP ML Lather also urged parents to keep an eye on what their children do on smartphones, besides attending online classes. Rajasthan director general of police (DGP) ML Lather on Friday said that a youth who raped a five-year-old girl in Jhunjhunu last month used to watch porn, adding that it was possible that after online classes, "children indulge in such things". "It is true that incidents of crime against women are on the rise. But, as far as law enforcement is



concerned, the police are taking swift action, whoever is the culprit will be arrested timely," the officer was quoted as saying by news agency ANI. He was responding to media queries on the issue of women's safety in the state.

When questioned on whether there's a need to change the mindset, the DGP said, "Like in the recent Jhunjhunu case, it has come

to light that he used to watch porn and consume drugs. As we all know, due to Covid-19 lockdown, students have been forced to take online classes. Therefore, parents have had to purchase smartphones for their

children. It is possible that after their classes, children indulge in such activities. Parents should be careful about what their children are doing on smartphones besides attending online classes."

1.20 lakh litre liquor seized, 1800 arrested ahead of Holi

Patna, A consignment of 1300 cartons of liquor was seized in Bihar's Vaishali district on Friday. It included around 12,000 litre of Indian made foreign liquor (IMFL), which is witnessing a peak in demand ahead of Holi with revellers looking to stock up. The liquor, seized from two vehicles including a container from Lalgaon and Sadar police station area, is estimated to be worth ₹1 crore, said Vaishali SP Manesh.

The first consignment of 5,900 litre of IMFL was recovered near Langri-Pakad village on state highway-74 when training deputy superintendent of police (DSP)-cum-station house officer (SHO) of Lalgaon police station, Vipul Kumar, seized a truck bearing registration number UP-21N/6615. The driver and smuggler managed to escape from the spot. Another container bearing registration number MH46-AR/0577, ferrying 5,800 litre IMFL was seized on Hajipur-Mahua state highway-49, leading to arrest of Rajasthan based truck driver Krishna Ram. In the last 78 days, more than 1.20 lakh litre IMFL, spirit and country made liquor have been recovered from across the state, as per Bihar prohibition and excise department. Deputy excise commissioner Krishna Paswan said at least 1,800 persons have been arrested since January this year and following the CM's directive to crackdown on bootleggers. According to

police officials, IMFL is mainly being smuggled from neighbouring states of West Bengal, Jharkhand, Uttar Pradesh and even from Haryana and Punjab, following its high demand across the state. Officials said country-made liquor was also being smuggled to rural areas with ease. "As Holi celebrations are approaching, the rate of IMFL is set to spike. A bottle of whiskey is set to sell at ₹1200, half at ₹600, quarter at ₹300 and one carton at ₹9,000. The supply in villages is no less than in the cities, in terms of safety and easy ferrying," said an official. "In this festive season, anyone who smuggles liquor anywhere in Bihar will earn the highest in a month as its demand is skyrocketing," said a person associated with the liquor mafia, on condition of anonymity. Several people have died after consuming country-made liquor in Gopalganj, Muzaffarpur, Kaimur and Rohtas in recent times despite the prohibition. All officials are keeping a strict watch and raiding possible illegal gathering on the liquor manufacturing and supply of liquor. IG (prohibition) Amrit Raj said surveillance at border check posts has been stepped up to check entry of vehicles carrying liquor. In addition intelligence is being gathered on the illegal trade. Joint teams of the excise department and the police were engaged in preventing liquor smuggling, Raj added.

With ethanol policy in place, no food grains will now be wasted in Bihar: Husain

Patna, Bihar's industry minister, Shah Nawaz Hussain, has said no food grains will now be wasted as the Ethanol Production Promotion Policy approved by the state Cabinet on Wednesday allows investors to directly make ethanol from maize, molasses, broken rice, and rotten grains.

"This will bring money to farmers and make Bihar ethanol hub of the country," said Hussain as he introduced the policy to prospective investors on Friday. The new policy allows ethanol production from all feedstocks permitted under National Policy on Biofuels, 2018, and subsequently by the National Biofuel Coordination Committee.

Ethanol is widely used in alcohol production and now increasingly in motor fuel.

'Jharkhand would recommend SC to remove 50% cap on reservation': CM

Ranchi, The Jharkhand government would recommend the Supreme Court that the state is a votary to remove the 50 per cent cap on the reservation for the ST, SCs and OBCs in government jobs, chief minister Hemant Soren said on Friday. Giving his reply to the budgetary discussion in the state assembly, chief minister Soren said the apex court has sought views of all states on the issue and they would put forth their opinion accordingly. "Few states had crossed the barrier of 50 per cent, following which the respective high courts had quashed the decision. States have appealed in the Supreme Court. The apex court has taken cognisance and has now sought opinion over the removal of the 50 per cent cap for the ST, SCs and OBCs, a national issue. We have decided that we would recommend going beyond the 50 per cent cap," said Soren. Jharkhand is the second state after Rajasthan which would ask the Supreme Court to remove the 50 per cent cap on the reservation which was imposed in 1992 in the Indra Sawhney case that upheld the

Pathalgadi movement gets more refined, demands implementation of rules

Ranchi, Pathalgadi movement, once regarded as a tribal separatist movement, was now getting more refined and polished, as its supporters start to raise demand for strict implementation of laws meant for administration of scheduled areas (tribal region) identified under the Constitution. Pathalgadi is a practice adopted by many tribal villages in recent times to declare their gram sabha as the only sovereign authority, as per laws applicable in areas under fifth schedule of the Constitution. Under this practice, outsiders from entering, wandering, living or settling down in the village. Many residents of such villages abandoned their documents,

namely Aadhar, ration, and voter identity cards, as a show of protest.
